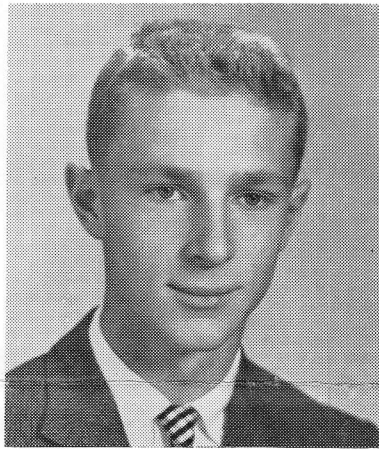
As for sports, softball is the big interest in Carol's life. She has played two years of junior varsity ball and was a varsity outfielder in her junior and senior years.

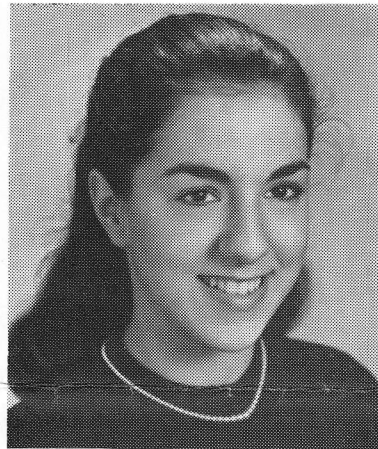
During the summer Steve plans to work for his father, and this fall he is planning to enter Lehigh where he will take an engineering course.

In September she is planning to enter Immaculata. She will major in secondary education and minor in French.

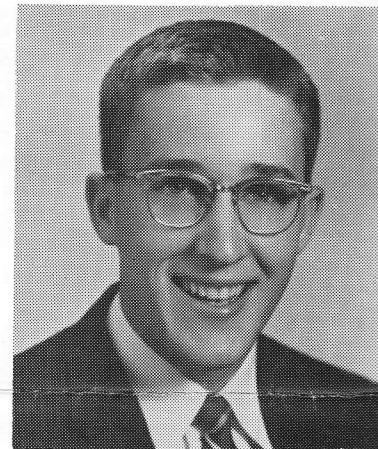
Everyone joins in wishing Flo the best of luck and happiness in the future.

**JON WRIGHT**

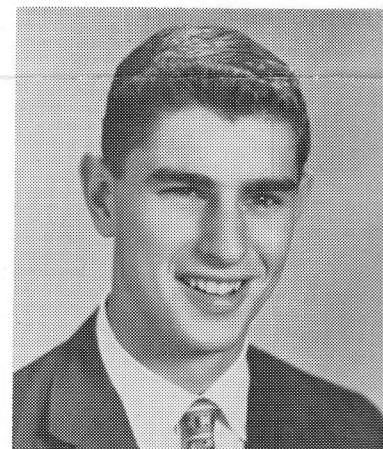
